Anita Howard (of NHS Cambridgeshire & Peterborough ICS (Integrated Care System), **South Cambridgeshire Integrated Care Partnership** spoke about the **LetsTalkRoyston** consultation which runs till 11th August. The integrated care approach seeks to integrate all services and bring professionals together – knowing your counterpart across geographical/specialty boundaries. There is recognition that "border towns" like Royston need special attention because of gaps and overlaps. e.g. Healthcare under 2 PCNs (Primary Care Networks) – Grant & Meridian, and social care which is under Herts not Cambs. The consultation is to start a conversation with people, understand where there are gaps, distances involved in getting blood-tests etc, who is not doing well and needs help, and to get this to them. Wider environmental factors (housing, nutrition, social issues) also affect wellbeing and the work at primary care level. They are aware that transport issues - e.g. to Cambridge - can be an issue and will be talking about walk-in clinics (here.) The consultation is about hearing the voice of those who access services, about health issues *before* coming up with a plan, not after.

Please encourage people to fill in the LetsTalkRoyston questionnaire on www.bit.ly/LetsTalkRoyston Please complete this online if possible, as it will help those collating responses. Staff resources to collate paper questionnaire answers are very limited. (NB. If one person has completed the questionnaire from your email address or computer ISP number, it may block another so as to prevent duplicated responses.) Paper copies (returnable by FREEPOST) are downloadable in PDF form, from https://www.cpics.org.uk/lets-talk-royston and in some locations in Royston e.g. surgery leaflet tables, and via HealthAid Royston (http://www.roystonhealthaid.org/ who will be advertising in the Listing that they can send these out. The magazine will be distributed to households in late July, 11+days before the deadline for responses.) Please let people know. Re publicising the consultation - there are toolkits with images for circulation online, e.g. for use on social media on https://www.cpics.org.uk/index.cfm?page=lets-talk-royston-toolkit . There will be a formal consultation about the Hospital later.

Questions/comments:

- HealthAid Royston hopes that we all realise that having suitable premises with room for clinics, etc., is a vital pre-requirement for provision of services. The Health Centre cannot be extended and Roysia are short of space, so cannot put on extra clinics. Other practices in the 2 PCNs could benefit from facilities in Royston, too. Royston Community Transport supports Harston and Comberton (both in Meridian PCN.)
- The Social Prescribers/Navigators in the GP surgeries are doing an excellent and very valuable job.
- People sitting in silos and not focussing on patients (e.g. the NHS Property Company) can thwart real improvement. We must grasp the opportunity for integrated care.
- Young people in the villages have difficulty accessing confidentialadvice in pharmacies and services too.
- The https://nessieined.com/ art workshops are a real boon, for upper primary/lower secondary age children.

John Hedges (including notes sent in advance) HealthAid Royston – Please see above about how they are helping to publicise the consultation, and let people who need paper copies know these can be obtained from HealthAid Royston. Their AGM was on 29/6/23, just as the news broke about the Let's Talk – Roystonconsultation. HealthAid Royston strongly encourages everyone to complete the survey, advising them to put "Having the right spaces to provide healthcare from" at the top of the list of needs in question 1. If this response was strongly supported by local people, it would enhance the Integrated Care Board's ability to put pressure on NHS Property Services via NHS England, to develop wasted clinical space at the hospital. It could support outreach mental health, geriatric, leg ulcer, obesity services, heart failure management, breathlessness management, diabetic eye screening etc, etc, clinics. This would strengthen community care and thereby take pressure off secondary care services at Addenbrookes and the Lister. Otherwise, the equity of a six-acre health services site in the town will be extracted by NHS Property Services and returned to central Government finances. As Royston sits on the border of two Integrated Care Boards, Cambs

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&Peterborough and Herts & West Essex, enhanced healthcare facilities in Royston will provide improved access to community healthcare in both ICBs.

RDCT- Royston & District Community Transport– had our first **summer barbecue for our volunteers** on Sat 8th. NHS Property Services would not let us hold it on the lawn outside the hospital. We remain short of **volunteer drivers** and had to cancel some trips in June due to our volunteers taking holidays outside school holiday times.
